## God Auction 2010!

The 8th annual God Auction is almost upon us. We will choose our patron for 2010-2011 on July 11th, between Artemis, Cai-Shen, Grandmother Spider, and Quetzalcoatl. The whole community chooses the new patron, voting with their donations of food, money, and time. Each year we collect monetary donations for Gaia Community and food donations for Harvesters at the God Auction, with one dollar or one food item counting as one point for the potential patron receiving it.

The daughter of Leto and Zeus, and the twin of Apollo, Artemis is the goddess of the wilderness, the hunt and wild animals, childbirth, and young girls. She was seen to be both the healer and bearer of disease in women. Seen as chaste, young girls would worship her until marriage, when they would leave behind their childhood and the virgin goddess. Artemis both hunted and protected wild animals. She is associated with deer and bears and is often depicted with bow and arrows. A further aspect of Artemis is that of a goddess of the moon. Her bow became a symbol of the waxing moon.



Cai-Shen is a Chinese god of prosperity and wealth. He is the Heavenly Treasurer in Chief. Cai-Shen is helpful in ensuring profit in commercial transactions. Once a mortal called Zhao, he was elevated to godly status after meditating on a mountain. Cai-Shen is often depicted as a fat and cheerful man with a thick mustache, riding a black tiger and wielding a rod of iron. Furthermore, Cai-Shen is said to ward off thunder and lightning.



Grandmother Spider is creator of the world in Native American religions and myths. She was responsible for the stars in the sky. She took a web she had spun, and laced it with dew. She then threw it into the sky, and the dew became the stars. Some tales relate that she sang throughout this creation. It is also said that this web she created is the web of life of which we are all a part. Another story tells of how Grandmother Spider successfully stole fire after several others had tried and failed and then taught humans how to tend and feed fire. In other tales, it is the sun that she stole.



Quetzalcoatl is the Mesoamerican feathered serpent deity. In Aztec lore, which is the most documented, he was related to gods of the wind, of Venus, of the dawn, of merchants and of arts, crafts and knowledge (he invented books and the calendar and gave mankind maize). He was also the patron god of the Aztec priesthood. Some stories tell of how Quetzalcoatl was responsible for the creation of humankind in the current age – combining the bones of humans from previous ages and his own blood. Another story tells of how he was tricked into sleeping with a celibate priestess, and in his remorse, burned himself to death. His heart became the morning star.

# Non-Gendered Restrooms Proposal

## Proposal

**PURPOSE:** To support our mission as a Welcoming Congregation by ensuring that every member and visitor has access to the restroom without embarrassment, threat, or confrontation.

**THE ISSUE:** Transgender and genderqueer people, as well as cisgender people whose appearance does not conform to the stereotypical expectations of their gender, are often unable to use public restrooms without harassment, threat of violence or arrest, embarrassment and confrontation with others. In order to avoid these confrontations, which can happen in both men's and women's restrooms, many trans people and others avoid going into public restrooms entirely, which can lead to health problems. Gender-segregated restrooms also present problems for people with disabilities whose attendant is not of the same gender they are, and people caring for children who are not of the same gender.

**PROPOSAL:** That Gaia Community declare the two upper-level restrooms gender-neutral space while we are using the building. This would be communicated by hanging signs over the existing Women and Men signs outside the upper level restrooms that indicate the bathroom as gender-neutral. These signs would also contain a brief statement about why we are doing this, and directions for people who wish to use gender-segregated restrooms to take the stairs or elevator down to the lower-level restrooms.

## Avenues to Discuss the Proposal

- On Tuesday, July 20<sup>th</sup> at 7 PM, the Queer Allies Discussion Group will host a town hall meeting at SMUUCH specifically to discuss this proposal.

## Non-Gendered Restrooms Proposal (cont.)

In March of this year, I attended a conference for high school and college youth who are leaders in the LGBTQQIAA community. It was held in a building on UMKC's campus that I had never been in before. One of the features of the conference that I found initially intriguing and eventually absolutely effective and fully welcoming of all people was that all the restrooms had a sign over the normal gender sign indicating that the restroom was gender neutral, along with an explanation of why this was so.

I used the restroom several times that day, as one does, and each time I found myself in the restroom that had been built with urinals. Each time, the mix of people in the room included people who lay all along the gender spectrum (and off of it, probably; I didn't ask). The general atmosphere in the restrooms was a bit of laughter at being in the "men's" restroom, but nothing directed at a person. In fact, the comfort of those folks who often feel at their most vulnerable in a public restroom was obvious.

This was made most clear to me after I attended a panel which included several transgender folks, who then wandered off in search of a restroom. Rather than drawing stares about which one they chose, people simply accepted their presence without questions or embarrassing gawking.

I grant that the nature of this conference means that the people in attendance were in some sense self-selected to be more ready for this sort of change. However, I think our congregation can step up and make this change, too, especially with the option of segregated restrooms on the lower level.

With this in mind, I brought forward a proposal at June's Ritual for Business to offer non-gendered restrooms at Gaia. There were some concerns raised that were addressed briefly, and it was agreed that we would revisit the proposal in August. Part of the intervening time would be used to get the word out to the community about the proposal and to hold a meeting in July to address concerns.

One of the first concerns raised about the proposal concerned children. Specifically, the concern was that using a restroom not of the child's gender makes the child more susceptible to abuse by an adult. I have no hard evidence for either side of this argument. However, I do have some information that may help. Our KidSpace program models a sensible rule for children and restrooms. Younger children are accompanied to the restroom and older children go in pairs. Now, our children are not always in KidSpace when they are at Gaia. During potlucks and before and after services, children are in the care of their parents. I would like to urge our community to do two things: to trust the parents in our community to protect their children and to keep our eyes open. We can protect our children in the entire building if we all agree to keep an eye on them. In fact, in a gender neutral restroom, the number of community members available to protect a child doubles. Furthermore, it is more likely that a young child will be accompanied to the restroom if any adult can take them, regardless of gender.

The safety of women is often raised when a person or organization is moving to introduce gender neutral restrooms. A resource for this very process we are going through points out that it is only a sign that proclaims a restroom is for women and someone truly seeking to harm women will not be deterred by a sign. In fact, a restroom that is not gender-segregated is a busier place and therefore safer.

The last concern that has been raised regards comfort. It is certainly understandable that using a restroom with those who are not of the same gender might cause discomfort. I have three responses to that. First, change is uncomfortable and always will be. Second, I challenge each of us to try just once and see if it really makes a difference. Third, because the building we use has restrooms on both levels, there will always be the choice to use the restrooms on the lower level.
