## 2010-2011 Budget Process Begins This Month

The Stewardship Committee will present a draft budget for Fiscal Year 2010-2011 at the Ritual for Business this month. The budget will be available for comment until the June Ritual for business, at which time, the Committee of the Whole will have the ability to consense to adopt the budget for next year. Gaia's fiscal year runs from July 1 to June 30.

Thanks to all those who made a financial commitment to the community as a Member or a Friend this year, the budget includes not only the money necessary to meet our basic needs, but also the ability to send representation to denominational conferences, rent storage space for our large ritual items, and more. The total projected expense for the next year is \$27,375, with most of the expense coming from rent, UUA and Prairie Star district dues, and expenses related to Sunday ritual and KidSpace services.

Over the next fiscal year, we will also be adding a new fund-raising event to the calendar, a family-friendly Longest Day party at Midsummer. The party joins our God Auction, Garage Sale, and Longest Night Ball as additional income generators for the community.

A copy of the proposed budget is also in this copy of the Earth Healer (see pages 5-6). Please review if you have an interest in contributing to the budget approval process, and send comments to John, our Treasurer, in person or by email at [treasurer@gaiacommunity.org](mailto:treasurer@gaiacommunity.org). ### Sunday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>

#### High Holiday - Beltane

*Ritualists: Devin, Kit, and Linda*

Join us for our outdoor picnic (weather permitting) celebration of Love in many forms and our community Beltane potluck following the ritual. Our younger community members will be joining the ritual for most of the time; nursery care will be provided for the whole ritual. Feel free to bring beads or items symbolizing Love to you that can be threaded onto ribbons.

### Sunday, May 9<sup>th</sup>

#### Workshop - Shamanic Journeying

*Facilitators: Kitty, Cheryl, and Aubry*

This class is designed as an introduction to Shamanic Journeying. A shamanic journey is a trip from a point in ordinary conscious reality through an opening of some kind and into a pathway leading to non-ordinary reality, sometimes called the shamanic state of consciousness. The vehicle for this is the sound of the shaman's drum. Shamanic journeying can be used to obtain knowledge, power or healing, either for oneself or for others.

In this workshop you'll have an opportunity to undertake two shamanic journeys. The first will be a short journey to learn to experience the shamanic state of consciousness and how to move in it yourself. The second will be a longer journey to find a power animal. Those experienced in shamanic journeying are invited to use the time and drumming to journey where they will. Participants are encouraged to bring a large towel to lie upon and a small scarf or bandanna to cover their eyes while journeying.

#### Ritual - Get Bent

We hear the terms gender identity and sexual preference everyday in the media and on the street. What do we mean by them, how do we define them, how do the people around us define them? How do we responsibly assert our own identities while avoiding judging others?
